

Panos Panagopoulos, Civil Engineer, Ph.D. is President of the European Federation of Engineering Consultancy Associations (EFCA), representing professional engineering consultancy and related services in Europe.

EFCA, founded in 1992, has member associations in 26 countries with firms employing one million staff and a turnover in excess of \$35 billion. It represents the business interests of the European engineering consultancy services sector to the European institutions; provides a strong and cohesive input to legislative actions of its member associations on issues affecting market conditions; offers a European-wide platform for member associations and their member firms to gather relevant facts and discuss business issues with their counterparts; delivers information on the latest EU legislative initiatives affecting business and the actions undertaken by the federation; and brings best practice in association management to its member associations.

Panos Panagopoulos was born in Johannesburg, South Africa in 1954 and completed his primary education in Greece in 1972. In 1977 he graduated from the Civil Engineering Department of the National Technical University of Athens. Subsequently, he studied in the University of California, Berkeley, where he earned a Master of Engineering (1979) and Ph.D. in Civil Engineering (1982).

From 1982 until 1989 he was employed in Geomechaniki Ltd., a geotechnical engineering firm, and subsequently ADK Consulting Engineers S.A., a multidisciplinary consulting engineering firm. In 1989 he founded ECOS Consulting S.A., an acknowledged engineering consulting firm in the water sector, and in 1992 he established Geoconsult Ltd., a geotechnical engineering consulting firm, with Thanos Platis, a fellow Berkeley graduate.

Panos has also served the Hellenic Association of Consulting Firms (HELLASCO) for a number of years as General Secretary (1996-1997), subsequently as President for two consecutive terms (1998 to 2001) and finally as Vice President (2002-2004).
